Timeline for Registration/Lottery

- Opens January 13, 2025
- Closed February 11, 2025
- Lottery February 12, 2025
- Results of the lottery sent within 10 business days of the draw (February 27, 2025)
- Families must accept or decline within 10 business days from the date of the acceptance letter
- If you have applied to more than one program that is in Lottery, please wait until you have heard your Lottery results from all the schools before accepting one

How We Prioritize Students For Lottery

There are 3 steps to determine the priority for accepting a student into a lottery school.





• Students residing within the walk zone who have a sibling (brother/sister [half or step, not cousins]) that will be attending the same program in the same school; concurrently (occurring or existing simultaneously).



- Students living outside the walk zone but in the designated area for the school, who will have a sibling in the same school at the same time; or
- Students living within the walk zone who do not have a sibling in the school.



All other students living in the designated attendance area.

Inform | Transportation

- K-5 yellow bus transportation provided following CBE congregated stop guidelines for alternative programs
- Transportation for grades 6-9 may be offered through congregated yellow bus stops or Calgary Transit (no rebates are provided)
- Parents pay an annual fee for CBE yellow bus service or purchase monthly Calgary Transit passes
- Congregated stops are reviewed annually and informed by pre-registration for transportation, online through MyCBE/PowerSchool
- Congregated stops may not be within walking distance and alternate arrangements may be required to access the congregated stop
